





Notes from Greg and Dave

Tow do you market fun? Even the most optimistic golf industry analyst will tell you that participation numbers have flat lined. You, I'm afraid to conjecture, just may be part of the problem. If you are having a difficult time finding a fourth player to fill your weekend tee time, then perhaps it's time you consider your oncourse behavior. We are not talking here about hotheads that slam and toss clubs; those behaviors almost always lead to a one-and-done relationship. We are skipping our Best Buys rating rubric for this month's course review. The par-3

layout at Zigfield Troy is a completely different animal than most golf facilities we visit; thus, we will not bother to compare apples to oranges.

The Troy name has been a part of Chicago golf for over 75 years. Zigfield Troy was a touring professional in the 1930s, and he had his own driving range in Chicago. In 1976, he moved the facility to its current location on 75th Street in Woodridge. Zigfield added and co-designed the par-3, nine-hole course in 1980. The course is

still owned and operated by his three sons: Dennis, Tim, and Mike. Following the lead of their father, all are exceptional golfers.

Zigfield Troy Golf is more than just an executive course. The facilities include a driving range and an alpine mini-putt course that is a no-brainer for families to enjoy. I plan to bring my kids back to play both courses.

The staff is to be commended. "Sarge" greeted us as if we were old friends and provided a few pointers on how to attack the course. Staffers at golf facilities across Chicagoland could learn a thing or two about customer service from Sarge.

The par-3 course is neat. Each green is contoured and challenging. We met Dennis Troy after our round. I putted well and shared this with him. His responded thusly: "Sounds like we need to speed them up a little bit."

During our round, we saw both lovebirds and seasoned couples; a mix of junior golfers; and a few guys who were sneaking in a



Evans Scholarships Announced For Chicago Area Caddies

Nearly 100 students from across Chicagoland have been awarded Chick Evans scholarships, a full tuition and housing scholarship, for this fall. Evans Scholars are golf caddies selected based on a strong caddie record, academic excellence, demonstrated financial need, and outstanding character.

Area Design Firm Slated To Renovate Addison's Oak Meadows

Ch-Ch-Ch-Changes

At the 2008 British Open at Royal Birkdale Golf Club, Fredrik Jacobson found his ball on a slope in a bunker. He was concerned that the unusually strong winds might cause his ball to move after he took his stance, thereby causing him to incur a penalty stroke for the ball moving after he had addressed it. He expressed this concern to the referee, who replied that as play had not been suspended because of the wind, Jacobson needed to continue to play. Jacobson carefully entered the bunker and took his stance, and, sure enough, the wind caused the ball to move. The Rules of Golf then called for a penalty stroke after a player had addressed his

ball, and a player whose ball lay in a bunker or water hazard was considered to have addressed the ball when he had taken his stance. Note: outside a hazard, a player was considered to have addressed the ball when he grounded his club and taken his stance.

What was so disturbing about the Jacobson case was that, unlike a player whose ball lay through the green or on the putting green and could protect himself against such a penalty by not grounding his club, there was no opportunity for Jacobson to protect himself as he needed to take a stance to play the ball. This situation caused the Rules of Golf Committees of The R&A and United States Golf Association to review Rule 18-2b and consider how the Rule could be amended to avoid such a situation in the future. After several years of discussion, the two bodies unveiled a revised Definition of "Addressing the Ball" and Rule 18-2b, among the Rules changes for 2012. Now, a player is considered to have addressed the ball when he has grounded the club "immediately in front of or immediately behind the ball, whether or not he has taken his stance." Rule 18-2b still provides a penalty for the ball moving after address, but an Exception has been added to absolve the player from penalty when it is clear that something else (e.g., wind) caused his ball to move after he has addressed it. Therefore, if the Jacobson incident were to happen today, there would be no penalty, as he would not be considered to have addressed the ball, and he would play the ball from its new position.

The aforementioned illustrates -one of the more significant changes to the Rules of Golf for 2012. The fact that it may come across as less than earth shattering is a good thing. After all, as the first known written code of Rules dates back to 1744, it is reassuring that, after nearly 270 years, dramatic changes are not needed.

The other most significant change for 2012 involves Rule 13-4. Previously, except in rare circumstances, a player or his caddie was not entitled to rake a bunker before the player's first shot from it. The reason was that such raking would be considered "testing the condition" of the bunker (i.e., the player might learn about

> the depth of the sand). Over the years, that position led to a number of unfortunate penalties for well-meaning players. For example, a player's ball lies in the front of a long bunker; on the way to his ball, the player retrieves a rake from the back of the bunker, some 15 yards behind his ball, and instinctively tidies up the marks in the bunker caused by the lifting of the rake. Starting in 2012, there will be no penalty. This change is a positive one as (1) it is difficult to argue that a player could gain more useful information by raking than by digging in with his feet (which he is allowed to do), (2) players often breach this Rule while practicing proper etiquette (caring for the course), (3) this Rule is repeatedly breached by unknowing golfers at all levels and (4) the Rule already allowed raking before a second shot from the bunker. It is important to keep in mind that the raking, whether before a first or subsequent stroke from the bunker, may not breach Rule 13-2 (e.g., improve the area of intended stance for the next stroke).

he 6,810-yard course is decidedly strategic with splashes of heroic decisions throughout the RTJ Jr. design. Director of Golf Gabe Exiner does not hold back on exclamation points when he describes the course. "Every hole is unique and memorable," he says. "They play differently each day depending on the wind conditions and tee placements." He adds, "Regardless of playing ability, players are challenged day-in and day-out." One surprise players new to the club will appreciate is the dramatic elevation changes. By the middle of your round, it is very easy to lose sight of the fact that one is standing in Northern Illinois where most of the land is as flat as a Milwaukee bowling alley.


The aforementioned dramatic elevation changes are encountered on the first tee. A downhill launch site is countered with an uphill, across-a-pond approach to the first green. This 426-yarder is not a firm handshake out of the box, but a call to bring your 'A' game after scorecards are exchanged. At hole 2, a strategic 405-yard, dogleg left, shot placement is essential to match par. Cutting the corner will lead to a likely blunder. Warns Exiner, "Choose your tee box carefully. It is a long way to clear the trees that run on the left side of the dogleg."

While it is difficult to name one signature hole at Crystal Tree, There are three that tickle the gray matter. The short, 148-yard 12th hole is reminiscent of the terrain in northern

Michigan. The one-shooter plays across a dry ravine and uphill to turtleback green. Exiner warns, "Missing the green is hazardous to your score." Take heed of his advice and dial in an iron toward the middle of the green. The most demanding hole from tee to green is the par-4, 16th hole. The approach requires the player to work the ball right to left. Once on the dance floor, rolling the ball toward the hole is tricky, with a raised spine bisecting the green.

Exiner describes the final hole as, "The most picturesque finishing hole in the Chicago area." Whether you are swinging from the tee box, walking down the fairway, or watching from the clubhouse veranda, this hole is special. Diagonal fairway bunkers and a water hazard line the right side of the hole, while the stately clubhouse rises above the mounding along the left side of the hole. While your eye will be drawn to the clubhouse, members will assure you that the green breaks sharply away from the clubhouse. Play a little more break and keep it on the pro side.

A great track at a private club in Chicagoland is not hard to find. However, at some private clubs, a new member trying to find a game can be as difficult as the application process to join the club. This is not the climate at Crystal Tree G and CC. Membership director Carl Cutinello shares, "Our club has designated tee times for member-only play. 

The Proven Path of GolfTEC

Back in 1995, Joe Assell and Mike Clinton had a theory about golf. While hundreds of millions of dollars were spent annually on high-tech golf clubs and golf balls, players seemed to be ignoring one other important aspect of the game: how to play it.

Fellow graduates of the golf management program at Mississippi State, the two men developed a golf instruction program that they believed could revolutionize the game. The plan called for a standardized, structured teaching format taught by PGA professionals who would use state-of-the art technology to work one-on-one with students. Today, 17 years after implementing their business theory, Assell and Clinton oversee 145 GolfTEC centers across North America run by over 350 PGA professionals.

Kurt Kollmeyer, who manages GolfTEC operations across the North Chicago region and also serves as director of instruction at the Vernon Hills location, joined the company during its infancy. "It seems like a long time ago," he says while gazing at a map showing GolfTEC locations. "But in a relatively short span of time our staff has literally given millions of lessons to hundreds of thousands of clients."

The gateway to the company's success, says Kollmeyer, is through a process used at every facility. "All of our centers use the same five factors to help our students," he says. The strategy starts with video and motion measurement of a player's swing. That swing is then compared on a video monitor to the swings of over 150 Tour players to analyze the differences. "We might spend 45 minutes in the interview and diagnosis process without hitting a golf ball," Kollmeyer says.

Following the initial analysis, lessons create a start-to-finish swing sequence that can be repeated by the player over and over again. Next, performance videos are posted on a GolfTEC website and feature the player's swing videos, along with the coach's notes and practice drills to reinforce every aspect of the improvement program. "Players can access these videos and receive lesson recaps 24/7," Kollmeyer says. The final two steps are practice sessions that utilize interactive video feedback with slow motion and stop action

sequences, and precision-matched clubs to ensure that the player is using equipment that fits his or her game. The personal club fitting process integrates motion measurement, digital video, and a database providing close to 1,000 club options.

Kollmeyer emphasizes the stark contrast between the methodology used at GolfTEC centers and the techniques used at golf schools, ranges, and many retail shops. "For starters," he says, "our statistical analyses of the Proven Path method shows a 95% success rate for our clients. We also firmly believe that the video comparison between the player's swing and a Tour player's swing is invaluable.

"All of our lessons are one-on-one," Kollmeyer continues. "While someone might point out that group sessions are cheaper, I don't buy into that theory at all. Focusing on a single player in a private session ensures that the player receives

100% of the coach's attention. A group session, on the other hand, can mean lots of distraction in between swing tips, which can cause some students to quickly fall back into their bad habits."

According to Kollmeyer, most every GolfTEC center is designed the exact same way to reduce variables. "We video conference each other regularly to ensure that every center uses the same techniques and the same strategies," he says. "I'm pretty sure that if a student visits a GolfTEC center in California, he will get the same instruction and have the same experience he would receive in Illinois or in Florida." Along with full swing analysis, coaches also work on chipping and putting


In 2004, GolfTEC formed a partnership with Golfsmith and offers its Proven Path process at over 57 Golfsmith retail stores to complement its stand-alone stores. In total, there are currently 10 GolfTEC centers in the Chicagoland area, including Lincoln Park, Deerfield, Des Plaines, Downer Grove, Oakbrook, Schaumburg, and Naperville.

U.S. Women's Open Championship Preview

Tt's hard to believe that it's been 14 years since the 1998 U.S. Women's Open Championship was last staged at Blackwolf Run in Kohler, Wisconsin. The 2012 version on July 2-8 will feature great players from the past, including 1998 Champion Se Ri Pak; Hall-of-Famers Juli Inkster (1999 and 2002 Champion); and Karrie Webb (2000 and 2001 Champion). Also in the field is 2011 Champion So Yeon Ryu who defeated her fellow countrywoman Hee Kyung Seo in a three-hole playoff at the The Broadmoor in Colorado. Other notables vying for our national championship include Michelle Wie, Brittany Lincicome, Paula Creamer, Natalie Gulbis, Cristie Kerr, Morgan Pressel, and the world's No. 1 ranked golfer, Yani Tseng.

The tournament hosts a field of 156 professional and amateur female golfers from all over the world. Amateurs and pros alike can try to qualify for the Open approximately four to six weeks in advance of the Championship at qualifiers held around the country. If you are an amateur trying to qualify you must have an up-to-date USGA Handicap Index not exceeding 4.4. To give you an idea of how many ladies try to qualify annually, since 2004 between 1000 and 1200 pros and amateurs have aspired to join the field of 156 competitors each year—so you better have your 'A game' if you try to qualify!

The Golf Course

Blackwolf Run was designed by the venerable Pete Dye and opened for play in June of 1988. It was named that year's "Best New Public Course" in the country by Golf Digest. Both the River and Meadow Valleys are regularly ranked in "America's 100 Greatest Public Golf Courses" by Golf Digest and the "Top 100 You Can Play" by GOLF Magazine. The course has been host to several professional championships, including The Andersen Consulting World Golf Championships in 1995, 1996, and 1997.

The current layout is comprised of two beautiful and challenging 18-hole courses: the Meadow Valleys and River. However, for the U.S. Women's Open, it will revert to its original single-course configuration—the

same layout that the players experienced back in 1998. The single-course layout is comprised of holes 10-18 of the Meadow Valleys course and holes 1-4 and 14-18 of the River course. Course upgrades include renovated greens, new sand and contouring of bunkers, and new grasses throughout the 18-hole layout. Pin placements and weather conditions will play a key role in how hard or accessible the course plays during Championship week.

Several committees are already full so make your plans quickly if you wish to join in the fun of volunteering for this prestigious event. 



quick round during their lunch break. The driving range had a steady flow of players, too. Zigfield Troy is a great example of the Chicago golf scene.

We finished our round in under an hour. Mike Troy reported that this is a common occurrence. Playing time, he explained, increases a bit due to increased play during weekends.

The Linkrat will surely return! How can you not love a course where everyone walks? The chief complaints for declining participation in golf are time and cost. Zigfield Troy Golf provides solutions for both concerns.

Zigfield Troy has been around for over 30 years now. Even though I grew up only 10 minutes away, I never took advantage of the opportunity to play this course.

If I had played here during my junior golf days, today I would be a much better player. I will bring my kids here to learn the game.

Do yourself a favor and stop saying, "I'll get over to Zigfield Troy next year." Get out there and hit this sporty executive track and still have some money for lunch.



Golf Without Fear

Tf downhill sand shots terrify you, you're ■not alone. Many of golfers have told us that this is the shot they fear most in golf. Understandably daunting, this shot can be executed successfully with a few adjustments.

I tell my students to hit this shot the same way they would a downhill lie in the fairway. You take your normal setup, then move your front foot down the hill and lean your upper body forward to get perpendicular to the slope. Play the ball back in your stance—the more severe the down slope, the farther back it should be. Set up with your hands ahead of the ball.


From a wide stance with your weight on your front leg, play the ball back in your stance, and with your body leaning forward, you should be able to make good contact on a downhill sand shot. The key to this shot is staying down past impact. Your shoulders and upper body will remain perpendicular to the slope until the ball is well gone and you extend into a full finish. You may need to step through with your back foot to maintain your balance on the follow-through, which is perfectly fine.


Remember, too, that downhill lies (coupled with the back-in-stance ball position and hands-forward posture) tend to reduce the effective loft of your club. You may want to practice this shot with a higher-lofted club than usual to see how far and how high you carry shots with this escape technique. Once you see shots consistently escaping the sand trap and landing on the green your confidence will grow on these shots.


Phil Mickelson is the best I've seen at playing shots from downhill lies. He practices them all the time, even though they aren't easy or commonplace. Can you find slopes to practice on? If not, you may have to recreate them in your yard and try some shots with almostGOLF balls.

Downhill sand shots, when the ball is below your feet, can be extra difficult to play. I even know some PGA Tour professionals who don't particularly enjoy them, but we all have to deal with them, so we might as well get good at hitting them.

Understanding Impact

Rabito's Corner



ringe when I hear television commen-Lators say, "Whoa! He got ahead of that one," or, "See how she stays behind the ball at impact." I don't understand what they mean, because both must happen in a proper swing. At impact you must be ahead of the ball to strike it properly, but part of you cannot help but stay behind the ball, as well.

You already know what impact position looks like because you are inches away from it in a proper setup. In the first illustration, Rick demonstrates proper address position. Notice where his belly button, sternum, and forehead are in relation to the ball and to his spine angle.

To compress a golf ball, the club must strike down on the ball before the swing finds

its lowest point. The low point of a golf swing is directly below your sternum, so you must get your sternum ahead of the ball at impact. Your head stays behind to maintain proper


In the next frame, Rick demonstrates proper impact position. He has transferred his weight to his forward foot, and his sternum has moved ahead of the ball. So has his belly button. Rick's spine angle has stayed the same, keeping his head slightly behind the ball.


Staying behind the ball leaves your sternum—the low point of your swing behind the ball. This is what promotes chunked and topped shots. You're going to have to hit the ground first without making some radical adjustments.


The force generated in a 100-mph swing can turn a golf club effectively into a 60-pound weight and cause compressive forces on the spine of up to seven times a player's body mass. Staying behind the ball at impact is out of position, and a body out of position at impact—with these kinds of forces at work—is a recipe for trouble.

Golf is a sport—a violent sport, if we consider the energy and force a swing can generate. It becomes obvious why a golf swing can be difficult to control or cause injury. Control Your Ball Out of the Bunker

The Scoring Zone



Then I play with amateurs, it's easy to see that most players have never been taught the basics of bunker play, or how to vary their distance control.

Basic greenside bunker play, like all shots, starts with the setup. When players attend our Scoring Zone program, most players have made crucial mistakes before the club ever swings.

The first step in the setup is opening the clubface. The key is to open the face before the grip is taken with the grip end behind the leading edge of the club head. This is a very important point, because with the grip behind the leading edge, the back edge will contact the sand first, allowing the club to glide through the sand creating a shallow divot [photo 1 and photo 2].

The next step in the setup is to align the shaft of the golf club at a right angle to your intended target line (the direction you want the ball to fly).

The third and final step in the setup is to Stand to the Handle (STTH). Standing to the handle is the foundation of every shot we teach in the Scoring Zone program. The phrase STTH means a couple of things. First, point the butt of the club exactly at the middle of the body. Second, make sure that the spine is 90° to the ground. The common mistake we see in most players' setup is pointing the shaft forward while tilting the spine back. Whenever a player tilts back, they will end up hitting a lot of skulled and fat shots out of the bunker. STTH is one of the things we find to help players immediately start hitting the ball out of the bunker [photo 3 and photo 4].

Once a player learns to set up correctly, a basic bunker shot is executed by primarily swinging the club back, with the arms keeping the club head outside of the hands with the face rotated open [photo 5].

In the downswing it's a matter of swinging the club head back in front of the body so that it cuts across the golf ball with the face open. The lower body should stay firm while the upper body pivots left so the weight ends up on the player's forward leg.

Once a player learns to hit basic bunker shots with some repeatability, there are three keys to learning to control distance; club face, steepness of angle of approach, and clubhead speed. For a shorter bunker shot (5-10 yards), use your most lofted wedge (58 to 60 degrees preferably), and open the clubface more than normal. Remember to set the clubface open before you take the grip. When swinging the club back, hinge or cock the wrists sooner, creating a steeper swing. To hit a longer greenside bunker shot (30-40 yards), first consider trying a pitching wedge or even a 9 iron, then set the face very slightly open. Limit the wrist hinge and engage the shoulders, creating a wider, more powerful swing arc. To keep it simple at our Scoring Zone School, I often tell players the back swing for longer bunker shots is controlled primarily with the shoulders and arms while short bunker shots are controlled with the wrist and arms. The downswing for all bunker shots is virtually the same. Swing the club back in front of the body, rotating the weight over the forward leg and maintaining whatever loft is set at the address position.

When executed properly, with practice the keys will help any player become competent in greenside bunkers.











nless you are a card-carrying member of AARP, you were not alive when Arnold Palmer shouldered America's new found enthusiasm for professional golf. He may even be the reason your father began golfing. Arnold Daniel Palmer wasn't a country club kid that learned the game of golf as one of the spoils of the entitled. He was the son of a country club's greens keeper. When Palmer hit the Tour, he had Hollywood sex appeal, the forearms of a blacksmith, and the cocksure golf swing of a man with nothing to lose.

The Classic Palmer is a reflection of a man in his prime. Bestselling author John Feinstein narrates the impact Palmer has had on professional golf with this ode to an icon. Golf fans have heard many of Feinstein's tales, but even the most ardent student of the game has not seen Palmer's history in pictures.

Readers will quickly understand Palmer's initial appeal to golf fans of the 1950s through Walter Iooss' photography. Each image of Palmer's classic finish presents him in a meditative expectancy. Equally captivating are the faces of the gallery as they follow Palmer's shot as though it were a bolt of lightning hurled by a Greek god.

Palmer's legacy is brilliantly captured in The Classic Palmer. Iooss and Feinstein's efforts will one day be the tome of the King.





The Donald

no, this month's wines aren't associated with Donald Trump (a teetotaler, by the way), but rather, English professional golfer Luke Donald. The Luke Donald Wine Collection is the result of a collaboration between Donald and Bill Terlato, head of the behemoth wine distribution operation, Terlato Wines International.

Terlato first met Donald when the golfer was a student at Northwestern University. Terlato took lessons from Donald's coach, Pat Goss, who initially suggested the two get together. Along with an interest in golf, the two men shared an interest in sports cars and ultimately, wine.

Golfer-endorsed wines are a growing trend, and already include such players as Ernis Els, Nick Faldo, David Frost, Cristie Kerr, Jack Nicklaus, Greg Norman, and Arnold Palmer. In 2006, Terlato approached Donald with the idea of creating a pair of wines for him under the Luke Donald label. He was adamant, however, that he didn't want merely a celebrity endorser. Terlato wanted someone who would be involved in the development of the product. The wines that resulted from this partnership are serious wines, rather than a vanity effort (and are priced accordingly). 2010 Chardonnay

This 100% Chardonnay is sourced from vineyards in the Carnaros AVA, which lies at the northern end of San Pablo Bay (the northern section of San Francisco Bay).

The wine is pale yellow in the glass. On entry, it offers a full mouthfeel, That buttery sensation continues to develop on the palate, followed by just the right amount of acidity.

For this wine's flavor profile, Donald looked to the white Burgundies of France. The flavor is predominantly of tart citrus fruits; the wood (25% new French oak, 75% used French oak) is there, but is nicely balanced.

Enjoy this wine with Summer Vegetable Stir-fry with Couscous, Braised Greek Chicken and Artichokes, or Almond-crusted Sole with Leek-and-lemon Cream.

2009 Claret

Befitting Donald's background, this red wine blend is a Claret. Although "claret" has no legal definition, it is generally a term used by

the English when referring to certain red wines of Bordeaux with a light, refreshing style.

This easy-drinking red blend (mostly Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, 100% Napa Valley) is transparent ruby in color. The taste features wild black berries and subtle spice notes. This is supported by well-integrated tannins.

This Claret would go well with Chicken Simmered with Cream and Onions, Roast Duck with Cherries, or Braised Ham with Mushroom Stuffing.

These wines are limited production, each limited to less than 1000 cases, but are well worth seeking out.

For the Love of the Game

Tt's a cliché often heard in professional sports, yet fans • oftentimes have a hard time believing most anyone plays anything for "the love" anymore. Money makes the world go 'round, and it's no different in athletics.

Yet there's something about golf that is connective, even though the sport can be very exclusionary.

Fans can relate to Kevin Na's 16, Ernie Els' putting woes, and even Tiger Woods' club kick. We've been there, done that. We may not see that money, or the endorsement deals, or play the best equipment, but there's an emotional rollercoaster everyone from Joe Sixpack to Rory McIlroy has thrown up on.

The love of the game comes through in golf, thanks in large part to guys like Winfield's Kevin Streelman, who busted it around the mini-tours for years, putting more zeroes on his odometer than his bank account.

He finally made it to the PGA Tour, and has figured out how to survive and thrive out there. This year, the 33-year-old who grew up playing Arrowhead Golf Club and Cantigny Golf in Wheaton has made the cut in six of his 11 starts through the Valero Texas Open, with four of them resulting in top 25 finishes, including two in the top 10 at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am and the Transitions Championship.

He's a millionaire, by career earnings, yet he's never forgotten what it's like to love the game - the good and the bad.

It's why he remains so connected to us, Joe Sixpack, through social media. He's active on Twitter @Streels54 and even jumps on the golf message board Golfwrx.com for chat sessions.

It's a unique step not many Tour pros take, yet it's one that comes second nature to Streelman. He may not have the hundreds of thousands of followers like Masters champion Bubba Watson (a win would change that, mind you) but he does connect on a real, personal level. His "Tweeps" find him on courses, say hello, share a laugh.

"I just enjoy talking to the fans and meeting them," he said. "I kind of view myself a lot of times as a fan, the way I was before I got on the Tour, and I know how I would have been liked to be treated."

It's a refreshing change of pace. For as connected as we all are now, it seems like the divide between fans and the athletes they cheer for is widening. Yet you can go look up how Streelman prepared for his first Masters by viewing his yardage book online. Or his measurements from a variety of other PGA Tour stops.

You can ask him about his favorite golf courses or holes on Tour, or here in Illinois. He'll even break down his equipment to the precise degree and flex.

"That's how I like to do it," he said. "I joke with guys who show pictures of their private lives, but I think it's cool when they show different [things]—if we're playing the 16th or 17th hole on Cypress right now and just put a picture up. It kind of lets people in on something you couldn't do in a newspaper interview or a TV interview. It lets people get a little closer. It's kind of fun."

It's fun for us, too. Maybe it's a Midwestern thing, but if there's one thing you can say about the man known affectionately as "Streels," it's that he does indeed love the game.

• It's never too early to think about the Ryder Cup this September at Medinah Country Club, and best believe Illinois' own touring pros have it in the back of their mind.

Through the Valero Texas Open, fellow Illini Steve Stricker was eighth and Elmhurst resident Mark Wilson was 11th. If Wilson doesn't play his way into automatic qualification, his third place showing at the WGC-Accenture Match Play might go a long way in the mind of captain Davis Love III.

"I haven't talked to Davis about the Ryder Cup," Wilson said. "I'm just letting my play hopefully speak for itself and play some good golf and make the team on my own. But getting all that experience there in match play that week, it was really neat to play six matches and get some experience so that the next time I play match play will probably would be the Ryder Cup if I do make the team. It's nice that I had that many matches to feel the heat of match play."

• You won't be seeing Blackberry Oaks Golf Course head professional Chad Johansen out on the course at a PGA Tour stop anytime soon, but you may be seeing him more around the putting greens, or even on television.

Johansen, who I profiled here in GOLFChicago in June of last year, has had over 70 PGA Tour professionals use his invention – The Perfect Putting Aid – this season.

It was even featured briefly on Golf Channel's "On The Range" when Bo Van Pelt shot a final round 64 at the Masters. Van Pelt, the No. 1 putter on Tour in the category of Strokes Gained, was shown using the aid during practice.

Other players who Johansen has personally shipped a Putting Aid to include major champions Jim Furyk and Y.E. Yang. 2010 PGA Tour winner Derek Lamely and former Ryder Cupper Chip Beck endorse the prod-

It seems like only a matter of time before a high profile touring professional latches on to this thing and takes it to another level.


