

Hit It Longer

Everyone who plays golf is constantly searching for a way to hit it farther. One way that is often overlooked is the bending and subsequently unbending of the right elbow. The elbow is a hinge, a powerful source of leverage. Properly utilized, it can add 11 percent more speed, which equates to more distance in your shot. During the backswing, the right elbow should begin bending when your hands reach your right knee and complete the bending (90 degrees) when your hands reach shoulder height. At the top of the backswing, the right forearm will be parallel to your spine angle and the elbow will be bent to a 90 degree angle. This

position will look much like a major league baseball batter awaiting a pitch.

On the downswing, the reverse happens. The right elbow must begin to unbend gradually beginning from the shoulder, and should be completely unbent by the time the hands reach the right knee cap. This process of allowing the elbow to straighten (unbend) on the downswing returns the right arm to its original address position. Unbending the right elbow creates speed and induces the lag in the wrists.

A common error that I see all the time is the player driving the right elbow towards

his hip. The act of driving a bent elbow toward your hip does not add power, in fact, it causes a casting action or early release, resulting in miss hits and loss of distance. Keeping the elbow bent on the downswing also causes the right shoulder to dip, which causes the hips to spin out to soon during impact. This is a big reason that a lot of people slice.

The right elbow is a hinge-power source: pure leverage. Unbend your right elbow and you will gain more speed and distance.



A Simple Plan for Better Wedge Play

The merits of being a better wedge player are obvious: by knocking wedge shots closer, you're facing shorter putts, and a higher probability of one-putting. Tour players knock wedge shots taken from 50 to 100 yards in the fairway to within 17 feet of the cup on average, and the best in the world can stick it to within 10 feet without batting an eye. Call me partial to the short game, but for my money, there's no better feeling in golf than catching a wedge right in the middle of the sweet spot and watching it fly high and stop next to the pin. Pulling this off is both athleticism and art.

The "secrets" to catching wedges crisp and knocking them close are anything but secrets. Here (in no particular order) are the three most important basics for hitting your wedges flush:

1. Play the ball in the middle of your stance. This will encourage you to strike the ball with a descending blow so you get less grass between the ball and the clubface.

2. Make your follow-through longer than your backswing. This will help you accelerate into and through impact.

3. Clean the grooves on your club-face after every shot and opt for a higher-spinning, urethane-covered ball. These gear adjustments will ensure a Tour-style "one-hop-and-stop" landing with limited rollout.

There's a point to pairing a long follow-through with a short backswing: It encourages you to remain aggressive between these endpoints. Otherwise, your contact will turn to mush. I see everyday players of all skill levels become hesitant, handsy or indecisive as they swing their wedges into impact. Let me be

clear: Impact is no time to think about...well, anything! Impact is "Go!" time. If you must think about something as you approach the ball, make it simple and helpful: "Accelerate and extend." Acceleration and extension give you shot-stopping backspin and centered contact on the clubface. Ideally, you want your left arm to "snap" straight as you strike the ball.

Here's your new wedge plan. First, find the backswing length that matches the distance you need to carry the ball to the pin. Next, make a few rehearsal swings, using these motions to flush out any doubt or hesitation. Then immediately settle into your stance and swing, thinking only about accelerating into impact and extending your left arm. With some practice, you'll be throwing darts at the green—and looking like a pro while doing it.



Amelia Island Resort Serves Spectacular

Florida's Omni Amelia Island Plantation Resort is kind of like a hotel version of that Leonardo DiCaprio character in the hit 2002 movie "Catch Me If You Can." You remember the storyline: DiCaprio plays a guy named Frank Abagnale who travels from one town to the next while believably impersonating a doctor, an airline pilot, a school teacher, and an assistant attorney. OK, although the parallel might be a weak one, this elegant complex 45 minutes from the Jacksonville, Florida, airport is defined in completely different ways by different guests. Some come to enjoy the facility's 3.5 miles of spectacular, pearl-white beaches. Others come to see and be seen at one of the two spectacular ocean-side pools, or to experience two or more of the diverse dining options, or to play tennis on one of 23 clay courts. And still others come to test their skills on one of three championship golf courses, each, of course, with a completely different personality.

If there is a consistent theme across the 1,350-acre property, it's the feeling of com-

munity that unites full-time residents with incoming guests. Over my short three-day stay at the resort, I was provided helpful tips by folks eager to serve up assistance and advice. Along with recommendations on where to get the tastiest appetizers ("crab cakes at the Verandah Seafood Restaurant"), I was advised on the best spot to hike ("Drummond Point boardwalk") and the best spa services to enjoy.

"We pride ourselves on the resort's welcoming spirit," says Donald Stamets, managing director of the complex. "There are so many things to do across the property that guests feel compelled to share their experiences with each other." Stamets adds that this spirit is enhanced by thematic events that bring people together. An annual "Fish to Fork" Culinary Weekend event features visiting chefs who prepare fish caught fresh off the island's coastline. Diners mingle with the chefs and each other as they vote on the best presentations.

Beneficiary of an \$85 million renovation in 2013, Omni Amelia Island Plantation Resort has a long history as a celebrated golf

destination. The marquee attraction is the Oak Marsh Course, a classic Pete Dye design that opened in 1972. Provided an amazing landscape of salt marsh creeks, moss-draped heritage oak trees, and oceanfront, Dye built a lavish collection of holes that are challenging and visually stunning. Don't be deceived by the course's modest length of 6,500 yards, as the landing areas for most of the par 4s are tightened by water and sand bunkers. The first few holes play over inland property and provide players with their best opportunities for pars and birdies. The 540-yard No. 2 snakes its way through oaks, sand bunkers, and a pond to a small, undulating green. At 317 yards, No. 3 looks like a cakewalk on the scorecard, but a landing area squeezed by two sand bunkers motivates a decision to hit a long-iron off the tee to set-up a mid-iron approach shot.

The final two holes on the front nine may determine the success or failure of your final score.

The 342-yard No. 8 features a fairway split by a river leading up to the green. A successful

tee shot here sets up a short-iron approach over the river to a long green protected by a devious bunker. The 527-yard No. 9 is the course's signature hole, as its entire right side is flanked by a spectacular marsh landscape. A long drive and a good second shot gives way to a short approach to narrow putting surface. Don't leave the green without admiring the natural beauty of the wetlands behind you.

You may just want to stop into the pro shop between nines to pick up a few more sleeves of balls as the back nine features marshland or ponds on all but two holes. The 377-yard No. 15 is only 377 yards from the championship tees, yet the long bunker that stretches on your right from tee to green virtually forces tee shots on this dogleg right to stay out of the trouble to the left side of the landing area. From there, a deft mid-iron shot to a smallish green is made more difficult by even more sand bunkers.

The 441-yard No. 17 is the toughest hole on the course. The hole begins from a peninsula tee built in the middle of the

wetlands. The tee shot to an undulating fairway must avoid the marsh along the left side of the hole and a sand bunker on the right side of the fairway. From there, a long-iron approach must somehow avoid the marsh and three bunkers to reach a slender putting surface.

The landing area on the 523-yard No. 18 is surprisingly generous. Forget about trying to reach this green in two, however, as the green is cut off by a bisected river that protects both its front and left side. As on No. 9, spend a little extra time to enjoy the surroundings.

Players on the first hole of the Ocean Links Course are excused if they feel a slight sense of *déjà vu*. While Bobby Weed is credited as the designer of this 6,300-yard gem, the first eight holes of the course (along with No. 17) were originally designed by Pete Dye in 1972. Weed extended the course to 18 holes in the late 1990s with the addition of Nos. 9 through 16 and No. 18. Both architects were provided ample plots of beachside property to create five holes along the Atlantic Ocean.

The 347-yard No. 4 is a challenging par 4 that features a hilly fairway paralleling the beach. Tightening the landing area further are two towering palm trees that rest on the left side of the landing area. Avoid these trees somehow and you are left with a short-iron approach shot to a raised green.

Holes 5 and 6 are consecutive oceanside par 3s. The 152-yard No. 5 features a green protected by dunes and natural grasses on the left side and the ocean on the right. No. 6 is no less intimidating as the player must overcome a large swatch of dunes to reach a large kidney-shaped putting surface.

Highlighting the back nine of the Ocean Links Course are two par 3s. The green of 187-yard No. 15 is surrounded on all sides by dunes and natural grasses. The 135-yard 18th hole serves up an island green made far less intimidating by an additional landing area short and to the right of the flagstick.

"The Ocean Links Course is an outstanding counterpart to the Oak Marsh Course,"



Topgolf Naperville Redefines The Golf Experience

Not too long ago, a golf driving range was defined as a dozen or so tee boxes resting in a field surrounded by a fence and decorated here and there with flagsticks. If the range owner was so inclined, additional amenities in the trailer that served as a service counter might've included some cold beverages and maybe a few partially-melted Snickers bars.

Even from a half-mile away, it is blatantly apparent that the new Topgolf complex in Naperville has more in common with a Las Vegas casino than it does with the driving ranges of yore. A long walkway from a huge parking lot takes guests into an elegant glass and brick \$20 million complex that serves as a cross between a sports bar, a nightclub, a trendy restaurant, an arcade, and an entertainment center that just so happens to also serve up the most exciting driving range experience of your life.

Sound too good to be true? Just ask one of a few hundred revelers who launched balls into the wee hours of the morning at Topgolf's grand opening party on September 1st. A DJ led a dance party on a rooftop terrace lined with chefs cooking up shrimp kabobs and slicing up slabs of prime rib. The complex's



102 climate-controlled hitting bays were alive with golfers who sipped on exotic beverages in between watching sports highlights on high-def screens in between taking turns on hitting golf balls.

While there are ample reasons to visit Topgolf without even hitting a golf ball, the fact is that the driving range aspect of the complex is even more dynamic than all of the entertainment amenities that go with it. In 2000, two brothers in England envisioned a new kind of golf experience that combined competition with entertainment. Players hit microchipped golf balls at targets on an outfield to score points. Picture a massive carpeted dartboard that uses flagsticks as targets. Shots hit close to the flagsticks register higher points than those hit further away. Tally those points at the end of a game to determine the winner. No need to bring pencils or paper to perform those extrapolations as computers do all the work and flash the totals on brightly lit screens. Even the old-fashioned method of collecting golf balls has changed as balls are delivered directly to your mat by a dispenser. Just wave your club in front of a light and out comes the ball ready to launch.

In between swings, players can order anything from chicken wings to quesadillas to turkey avocado wraps to burgers, along with a beverage menu complete with alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages of your choice, including the latest in microbrews. While waiters and waitresses cater to both your food and beverage needs, you may just want to take in a performance at the live entertainment stage, or visit one of the property's three bars, or play a game of pool or foosball or shuffleboard.

"We are really excited about how the city of Naperville has embraced us," says Brett Hintz, Topgolf Naperville's director of operations. "We hired 450 local residents to staff the operation and we are confident that we will become an asset to the community."

Down Memory Lane

Chicago was Hagen's Kinda Town

Before Arnold Palmer, there was Walter Hagen, a player who put on a show and whom the public found irresistible. Hagen won several times in the Chicago area, and twice at Olympia Fields Country Club. One of his five Western Open triumphs came there, in 1927, but two years before, he collected the third of his five PGA Championship crowns at Olympia, a success not without its harrowing moments.

He knocked off Bill Mehlhorn, then playing out of north suburban Westmoreland Country Club, by a 6 and 5 margin in the 36-hole final – opening with an eagle 3 on the par-5 first hole of what today is the North Course, but before that, Hagen had to fight hard to get through several rounds.

Hagen was the defending champion, but chose to play in the stroke-play qualifying rounds, so his score was used to place him in the bracket, and he met medalist Al Watrous in the first round. They would trade the lead in the afternoon 18, Hagen losing a one-hole advantage at the 36th hole when he failed to save par after missing the green.

They would go three more holes – to the third on the North – before Hagen scrambled for a par and Watrous bogeyed. The Haig was through to the second round.

A 7 and 6 rout of Mike Brady moved Hagen to a quarterfinal match with Canadian Open champion Leo Diegel. Hagen stumbled early, was 4 down after eight holes, and 5 down at lunch.

In the afternoon round, which was played on Olympia's No. 3 Course, Hagen rallied, winning three of the first six holes, but was still 3 down with four holes to play.

Hagen scrambled for par on the 33rd to cut the gap to 2 down. Matching bogeys on the 34th made Diegel dormie. Another halved hole, and it was over.

But, Hagen would have none of it. He won the 35th with a birdie when Diegel could only par, and won the 36th when Diegel couldn't get up-and-down from a greenside bunker.

This was vintage Hagen, and on the fourth extra hole, the 40th of the match, he used a big drive and solid approach to set up a two-putt par while Diegel topped his tee shot and failed to match the Haig, losing with a bogey.

William Richardson of *The New York Times* lauded Hagen, calling the comeback victory "the greatest of the many he has won during his matchless record as a professional golfer."

A victory that helped secure Hagen's position as the people's choice. —By Tim Cronin

Marquette University Freshman Earns Chip Beck Evans Scholarship

Josey Benandi wasn't even born when Chip Beck fired a 59 at the Las Vegas Invitational to change her



life. In 1991, Beck was the recipient of \$500,000 from the Hilton Hotels chain for equaling Al Geiberger's record low score at a PGA Tour event. An additional \$500,000 was awarded to the PGA of America and PGA Tour charities for the remarkable feat. At Beck's request, both associations earmarked their shares for the Chip Beck Evans Scholarship fund. At the BMW Championship Pro-Am reception held September 14th, Benandi was recognized for her hard work as a caddie at Ridgemoor Country Club, along with her high school achievements to earn a full housing and tuition scholarship. She is now a freshman at Marquette University in Milwaukee where she plans to study engineering.

Beck, who serves as a director of the Western Golf Association which support the Evans Scholars program, called it "gratifying" that he has been able to help deserving caddies from around the country continue their higher educations. "The Chip Beck Evans Scholarship is something I'm going to be proud of long after my playing days are over," he said. "Golf has been good to me, and I welcome the opportunity to give something back to the game."

Benandi spoke about her experiences at Ridgemoor C.C. located on the city's northwest side. "I have worked very hard at being a caddie," she said. "The job has helped to shape me into the person that I am today and eventually the person I would like to become."

More than 10,000 deserving caddies from across the nation have been awarded Evans Scholarships. The Evans Scholars program has been recognized as one of golf's favorite charities and is one of the country's largest privately sponsored scholarship programs.

McGirt, a 12-year Tour veteran, is actively involved with Camp Spearhead in Greenville, South Carolina, a summer program for children and adults with special needs.

Liston and McGirt played the first five holes at the prestigious Knollwood Club in Lake Forest, and enjoyed getting

to know one another. McGirt even hopped in a green-side sand trap on the par 5, fifth hole to offer Liston an extended lesson on bunker play.

After exchanging handshakes, Brian was then presented with a custom-built Wilson sand wedge by the Knollwood staff. The club had belonged to Pdraig Harrington, who happens to be one of Liston's favorite PGA Tour players.

With his dad on the bag and mom in the gallery, it was a very proud day both for the Liston family and the Niles West golf program.

"I couldn't be more proud of what Brian has accomplished this season," said first-year Niles West golf coach Dave Silbar. "There is no bigger Niles West fan than Bryan and he is a total team leader." Silbar adds, "His time with Will McGirt will be a memory to last a lifetime."

Billiter Captures Second IPGA Major for 2015

Merit Club's Jim Billiter's paced the field and won the 93rd Illinois PGA Championship at Medinah Country Club's Course One. The victory is Billiter's second IPGA major for the 2015 season. In



May, Billiter won the Illinois PGA Match Play title at Kemper Lakes. Capturing the Illinois PGA Championship in the same year puts him in company with eight other players, seven of whom are in the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame.

It was anything but smooth sailing for Billiter, who survived a case of the hooks,

including the tee shots on the 10th, 11th, and 12th holes.

"I had no business making par," Billiter said.

But, he did on all three occasions, twice thanks to remarkable recoveries from behind and around some of Medinah's thousands of trees. Billiter one-putted the first five holes on the back, including birdies on the 13th and 14th, and then parred in. Billiter and Conway Farms Golf Club's Matt Slowinski were the only two competitors to card sub-par rounds at the championship. Slowinski finished two strokes back with a 206. I was happy with the way I played today," Slowinski said. "I tried to make it interesting. It was going to be hard to catch Jim. When he hit bad shots, he was making nice pars, and on his good holes, he made birdies. He didn't really let anyone get close."

"I didn't think I could ever win this one," Billiter said. "I'm more a match-play guy." Billiter added, "I never thought I could win one major, much less two."

Defending champion Mike Small's even-par 70 lifted him to a tie for seventh at 2-over 215.

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


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

Mount Prospect Golf Club Reboots for the Next Generation of Golfers

Esler Renovation Earns High Praise

Our great city and surrounding suburbs are filled with rich tradition when it comes to the game of golf. Many legends have passed through, leaving behind memories that are forever part of Chicagoland's golf landscape. There are certain courses that have roots that run as deep as the history of the game in our country; however, contemporary expectations often require literal bulldozers to those preserve those roots. It's part of keeping up with a game that is forever evolving.

Mt. Prospect Golf Club has been a part of the local golf scene since 1926, when it was originally named Northwest Hills Country Club. The course opened as a nine-hole layout, nine more holes were added in 1927, and the original clubhouse was finished in 1930. So for nearly a century the course has been withstanding the test of time. Over those years, Mt. Prospect Golf Club has gained a cult following, especially within the neighborhood in which the course resides. To say that the course and 19th hole have "regulars" would be a severe understatement.

When the Mount Prospect Park District recently commissioned Esler Golf Design for a complete makeover, it did so knowing that Dave Esler and his team would be renovating a course that had not had its greens, bunkers, or fairways changed in their 90 years of existence. Esler, whose renovation work can be found locally at Chicago Golf Club and Shoreacres Country Club, brought a vision of challenging plateau greens, deep bunkers, and elements of British links-style golf holes.

When the course re-opened on August 1, it was instantly recognized that the \$7.1 million overhaul changed what the golf community knew as Mt. Prospect Golf Club. A somewhat simplistic layout with not too many twists and turns has been replaced with a challenging course accented with false-front greens, deep bunkers, and some of the most menacing green complexes this side of Lake Michigan.

When I finished my first round on the renovated layout, the main thing I took away was a resounding feeling of completeness. I imagined all parties involved with the renovation sat



down with a list of 500 or so items that might need to be addressed with check boxes next to them, and they just went ahead and checked them all.

Every green was resodded with the latest A-type hybrid bent grass. The top-down project also includes a new irrigation system, new bunkers, storm-water retention system, rebuilt tee boxes and fairways, new practice facilities, and much more. It's safe to say Mt. Prospect got everything on its Christmas list this year.

“Chicagoans have such a high architectural IQ, I want to see that extend into golf and hope it will be fun for folks to dissect the allusions and architectural references,” said Dave Esler. “Some are pretty obvious, some slightly obscure.”

Quite possibly the biggest difference to patrons will be the re-routing of holes. The first four holes on the back nine were altered to make way for the new par-3 10th hole (135 yards), the par-4 11th hole (435 yards), and the par-3 12th hole (180 yards). The back nine concludes with holes 14 through 17 on the same routing as the original layout, but the 18th hole did change direction slightly. The purpose of the big change on the back nine was to create a better finish to your round and allow for the new driving range and short game area next to the clubhouse. Alternations didn't end on the course either, as Mt. Prospect Golf Club now offers practice facilities comparable to the best in the area. The shiny new range has 25 stations and rolls out over 300 yards, all on bentgrass turf. The old 12th green is now that short game area complete with practice bunkers and a practice green—all designed to mirror what you'll see on the course. Director of Golf Brett Barcel has had a front row seat to the renovation and is proud of the job that has been accomplished.

“A lot of area courses have been renovated, but few have been specifically designed to capture their original design concepts, or have been created in classic design,” said Barcel. “The style of the course is unique in a market where courses are a lot alike in terms of the modern design architecture. If most courses are a Target or a Walmart, we are more of a boutique.”

As previously mentioned, the new greens are menacing. I'd categorize them as fun, severely undulating, challenging, and rewarding. But that's not all. When “Joe Golfer” who's never seen the course, let alone the renovation, takes a look at the scorecard and finds that the tips cover only 6,305 yards, it's understandable why you'd conclude it's going to be an easy day. Not so fast though. Dave Esler made sure to make you earn a decent score with the flat stick. Hit the par-5 15th hole in two did you? Congrats and best of luck not three putting. That could be said for any of the newly designed greens though, especially if you find yourself well above a front pin, or well below a back pin location.

“At the end of the day the fun is in the playing for most, but the historic characteristics add another layer of enjoyment for a lot of players,” said Esler. “Mt. Prospect will provide an opportunity for public golfers to experience a style of golf that has only been accessible to the very, very few and fortunate.”

The re-design of the course and facilities makes all golfers in the Chicagoland area the fortunate ones. Mt. Prospect Golf Club should be quickly added to your “must play” list because it's no longer your father's (or grandfather's for that matter) old layout.

The debate over the identity of America's "golf capital" has gone on for decades. Folks from the south say that it's Myrtle Beach. Folks from the west claim that it's California's Palm Springs area. And some Midwesterners chime in that Northern Michigan's outstanding array of courses puts that area into contention.

All that being said, it comes as no surprise to golfers that similar such arguments are made elsewhere around the globe. Some Canadians proudly call the 48 courses in Niagara their golf capital. Others declare the entirety of British Columbia the country's golf mecca.

While I don't claim a stake in any of these arguments, I returned from a September golf trip in Canada prepared to maintain that Prince Edward Island off the Gulf of St. Lawrence has quickly achieved the lofty status of these aforementioned golf destinations. Boasting 32 layouts, all within an hour's drive of each other, PEI takes a back seat to none when it comes to majestic landscapes, pristine conditions, and outstanding golf architecture.

A renowned region for growing potatoes and cultivating shellfish, PEI entered the conversation as a golf destination some 21 years ago when the provincial government developed the Links at Crowbush Cove, a

fantastical 18 holes built over rolling sand dunes and native spruce forests alongside the Atlantic Ocean. Built by Thomas McBroom, the 18 holes feature stacked sod bunkers and swirling winds to provide a links feel to a property recognized as Canada's best new golf course in 1994.

The construction of Crowbush Cove served as a fine complement to Green Gables Golf Club, a short distance up the coastline in Prince Edward Island National Park. That classic Stanley Thompson design has been heralded since it was built in 1939 as much for its location near the house that inspired the teen novel "Anne of Green Gables" as

for its pedigree as a world-class layout. The 6,874-yard gem was one of the first courses built on the island and maintains much of its original character, despite some major routing changes made to it during the early 1980s due to dune migration.

These two courses, alone, would have placed the island on the golf map if no other construction followed. Instead, dozens of area entrepreneurs and investors became intrigued by the possibilities golf offered the island's economy. Despite the downturn in golf construction in the U.S. during the early 2000s, one course after another was unveiled in an amazing display of chutzpah, many of them less than an hour's drive from Charlottetown, the provincial capital of PEI. Moreover, most can be played with a green fee well south of \$75 US. I booked a room at the elegant The Holman Grand Hotel (www.theholmangrand.com) which overlooks the city harbor, and features spa services and a short walk to the Charlottetown night life.

Fox Meadow Golf Course is only seven minutes from downtown, but offers both spectacular rural panoramas and views of the city harbor. At 6,836 yards from the back tees, the course is an ample test, as wide tee shot landing areas are tightened by sprawling sand bunkers and ankle-deep native grasses. The outstanding golf course is complemented by a world-class practice facility. The Fox Golf Academy is managed by top CPGA professionals who oversee two driving ranges, a short-iron range and various putting greens. Affordable camps and clinics are readily available.

Opened in 2001, just as the PEI golf boom was starting, the 6,915-yard Glasgow Hills Resort & Golf Club was designed by Les Farber and is a must-play course. Diverse terrain along with dramatic views of the River Clyde and the Gulf of St. Lawrence area are readily available across the course. Highlighting the front nine is the 367-yard No. 9, a wild dogleg left that calls for a precision tee shot to the landing area to set up a short approach shot to an island green further protected by two pot bunkers to the left of the flag and a narrow sand bunker behind the flagstick. Beware of No. 10, a downhill dogleg right that also slopes heavily to the right to make it difficult to keep your tee shot in the fairway. Following

your round, make sure to save some time for a cold beverage to go with complimentary fresh locally-cultivated steamed mussels.

Anderson Creek Golf Club was designed by Graham Cook and has hosted over 50 amateur tournaments since the 6,651-yard championship course opened in 2003. Located in Stanley Bridge just minutes from the breathtaking Cavendish Dunes, the layout features massive greens, impeccable conditioning and many confrontations with the namesake creek. As at Glasgow Hills, Anderson Creek G.C. features complimentary steamed mussels following your round.

Even though it's now considered one of the older courses in the area, the Links at Crowbush Cove remains one of the island's premier golf experiences. Enthusiastically rated at 4.5 stars by *Golf Digest* magazine, the course overlooks the north shore dunes of PEI and stretches to 6,903 yards. Following a curvaceous 409-yard par 4, the 366-yard No. 2 is a dogleg right that calls for a tee shot around or over four deviously placed sand bunkers to the right of the landing area. Skirt past those and you're left with a short-iron approach shot over a few more sand bunkers protecting a rolling green. Remember the days of yore when par 3s were fun and charming and not nerve-rattlingly difficult? The 113-yard No. 17 will make you smile and bring a par or birdie to your scorecard as a huge tee area opens up to a large multi-tiered green. Overcome the wetlands in front of the tee and you can't wait to get to the green for your birdie putt. Beyond outstanding golf, the Links at Crowbush Cove provides outstanding value, as an 18-hole round is only \$70 at peak season. And that's based upon the Canadian dollar which is extremely favorable to the U.S. dollar as of this writing.

No trip to the island is complete without a visit to the aforementioned Green Gables Golf Club in Cavendish. This forested, seaside course serves up classic, no-frills architecture over a heavily forested property. Fans of Robert Trent Jones golf courses will quickly find parallels with Stanley Thompson's work. Massive sand bunkers flank many sides of the large, rolling greens. Introduced in 2015, Green Gables Golf Academy features CPGA professionals providing affordable lesson options for golfers of all skill levels.

While there are well over a dozen other worthy golf courses to reference for this article, the best way to learn more about golf on Prince Edward Isle is to book a flight and visit the island's website to plan a trip. Go to www.golfpei.ca to learn more.

SOUTHWESTERN OASIS

Mention golf and the Sonoran desert, and players immediately envision a towering saguaro cactus reaching for the sunshine, while the desert floor painted in rich greens takes golfers on a step-stone journey. For Chicago's snowbirds, the mild winter season in Arizona is one of the reasons to own a traveling bag for your golf clubs.

A snowball-season getaway to the painted deserts of Arizona should include a half-day Sonoran Desert Tour from Desert Wolf Tours. The excursions are truly unique in that guests (over the age of 18) do the driving in Tomcars, which were originally developed for use by the Israeli Defense Forces special operations units. Desert Wolf Tours owns a fleet of these vehicles that guests self-pilot during guided tours through the beautiful Sonoran Desert. 

SENSORY OVERLOAD AT WE-KO-PA



When you think of the ultimate Arizona golf experience, what comes to mind? Is it the stunning scenery, on-course and off? The glorious mountain vistas in every direction? Do you envision gently rolling fairways ribboning through a lush desert landscape, with every hole framed by Southwestern flora?

We-Ko-Pa Golf Club, located just minutes from Scottsdale, is that special place you're thinking of. Since December 2001, all talk of We-Ko-Pa's Cholla Course has revolved around the gifts that nature has bestowed, and rightly so. Located on the Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation, We-Ko-Pa is blessed with jaw-dropping mountain vistas in every direction. In fact, "We-Ko-Pa" is the Yavapai pronunciation for "Four Peaks Mountain," a rugged rock formation that looms imposingly to the northeast.

"In terms of desert scenery, the breadth of the views out here has no equal," says We-Ko-Pa General Manager Matt Barr. "At any point in the round, you can look up and see a distinctive natural landmark, such as the Four Peaks to the northeast and Red Mountain

to the south, or the McDowell Mountains to the west."

Throughout one's round, you are greeted with all sorts of amazing light displays, as the shadows that are cast by the interplay of sun and mountains approach the artistic. At sunset, the colors and textures approach the surreal.

We-Ko-Pa's Cholla Course is the handiwork of architect Scott Miller. So spectacular are the views on the Cholla Course that the sound, strategic playing value of the holes that Miller designed could possibly get overlooked. Your first trip around will convince you otherwise. The variety in the routing and pacing of the holes will keep all levels of golfers entertained from opening tee shot to final tap-in.

"The variety that the Cholla Course provides is remarkable," says Barr. "The teeth of the course are its collection of par 4s. We've got a number of holes that will demand the biggest and best from scratch players, such as the 4th, which runs about 470 yards and the 6th which checks in around 435 to 440. Number 16 is another stout par 4, a dogleg left. However, balance is provided by holes such as number 1, a drive and pitch-type hole, and by the 15th, which

is drivable under the right conditions."

The Cholla Course features an ideal blend of doglegs and straightaway holes, a mix of slender and ample fairways, and a balance of benign and rugged green complexes. The long and strong will challenge all of Cholla's 7,225 yards, but well-spaced multiple tee boxes allow every type of player to enjoy the course, especially from the friendly front tees, which measure 5,289 yards.

The noted golf course architectural team of Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw designed We-Ko-Pa's second 18, the award-winning Saguaro Golf Course. Open since December 2006, Saguaro has design elements not commonly found in the desert Southwest. Saguaro is much like the older more traditional courses found on the east coast, where greens are close to tees and the course follows the natural movement of the land making walking easy and enjoyable.

In Saguaro, Coore and Crenshaw re-introduced the all-important art form of tying the entrances to the greens into the greens themselves. The majority of the greens are open in front to allow for run-up shots.

It is the subtle pitch and roll of the terrain on the approach to the greens that give each hole much of its unique playing characteristics.

Stretching 6,912 yards from the tips and playing to a par 71, Saguaro has been featured in numerous golf publications including *Golfweek*, which currently ranks it as the #1 public access course in Arizona. In addition, *GOLF* magazine named Saguaro one of the "Top 10 Best New Courses You Can Play" in the United States in 2007 and it currently sits at #41 on *GOLF*'s list of "Top 100 Courses You Can Play."

"This piece of land has some very interesting natural movement to it," said Crenshaw of the Saguaro course. "I think this golf course is pretty unique for the desert. People are asked to play different shots and find solutions to new challenges when playing this course."

We-Ko-Pa's two courses, Cholla and Saguaro, have much in common – both are meticulously maintained, both have received high praise from the golf media and consumers alike, and both offer a tranquil golf experience free of houses and roads, thus preserving the unobstructed mountain views of the Sonoran Desert. Or, more succinctly put, We-Ko-Pa is "Arizona's ultimate golf experience."

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HIGH DEFINITION GOLF AT VERRADO GOLF CLUB



Over ten years ago, DMB, Inc. unveiled what has become the wildly successful master-planned community of Verrado. Set on just over 8,800 acres once used as the Caterpillar proving grounds, DMB, Inc. gave carte blanche to Tom Lehman and John Fought toward creating what is now one of Phoenix's premier golf destinations.

Shortly after debuting in January, 2004, *GolfWeek* awarded the Verrado Golf Club with "America's Best 2005 – Top 40 New Golf Courses." Many accolades have since followed, including *Golf* magazine's "Top 10 New Golf Courses you can Play," *Golf Digest's* Power Rankings, and most recently *GolfWeek's* 2014 Best Courses you can Play ranking of #9 of the 25 best in Arizona.

With 18 championship holes, the golf course features a dramatic mountainside setting with massive rock outcroppings, large desert washes, picturesque box canyons, and dramatic elevation changes. The course also offers magnificent views of the nearby White Tank Mountains and the Phoenix skyline. From the tips,

Verrado plays to nearly 7,300 yards giving even the most accomplished player a thrilling test of golf. However, course architects Fought and Lehman created the course with generous landing areas and five sets of tee boxes, ensuring players of all abilities a legitimate chance at par.

Claiming all holes are worthy of the ever popular "signature hole" Verrado is without only one, instead choosing to highlight four of the best.

If you like downhill par 3s, hole #3 is for you. At 222 yards, perched well above the green, this tee box offers great views of the surrounding valley. Play to the middle of the green and walk away satisfied with par. Notable fall offs on this green would be the deep bowl on the right side leading to a difficult pitch back onto the green.

At 477 yards, hole #8 is a par 4 with the #1 handicap title attached. This long, demanding hole requires a tee shot hit just right of the massive rock outcropping in order to successfully reach the fairway. Once safely on the fairway most will find they are faced with a long iron into a well protected green. Although

a fairly easy green to read, make sure to adjust for the slope off of the White Tanks.

If you had to pick just one, hole #13 a short par 4 dead uphill, would be the one. Only 310 yards sounds like a walk in the park, but not here. Hit a middle iron off the tee and error long on your approach shot for the best chance at par. With only two possible pin placements, this tiny green slops back to front on both tiers. Good luck!

Everyone loves a great finishing hole, and this par-4, 495-yard hole just might be the best in Arizona! Playing downhill and downwind this hole provides a great view of the clubhouse and the entire valley beyond. After successfully navigating the fairway bunkers, one is faced with another downhill shot to a well protected green.

With so many great holes, course conditions to compliment each of them, and service to make them all unforgettable, what else could you ask for? Well, the dining at Verrado Grille is equally impressive, whether enjoying dinner on the patio while watching a beautiful sunset, hanging out with friends listening to live music in the Grille on a lively

Friday night, or having a family gathering in the dining room, you'll be treated like one of the family at the Verrado Grille.



The 19th hole is usually of equal importance to the golf course itself for any golf experience, and the Tonto Bar and Grill is only a few short steps away and captures the rustic desert ambiance of years gone by with hand-carved beams of the historic ranch ceiling still in place. With two dining areas inside and a covered patio overlooking the 11th green, the facility certainly provides a cozy spot to relax after an enjoyable day on the links.

In addition to offering cold beverages, great care is taken to ensure the menu is second to none and that it fully embraces the local flavors of the southwest. Chef Eric Flatt and his staff also aim to preserve Arizona's heritage through our cuisine and by sharing the stories of our property's past. 

Back to Action

I hope that it was a successful golf season, free of injury with plenty of picturesque shots to remember as you slog into our Midwest winters. However, if you had an injury, most commonly low back pain, you are not alone as chronic back pain affects two-thirds of adults at some point.

The golf swing involves all the motions of the lower back. Pain or limitations in any of these motions will alter your swing and create very frustrating results. It does not take injury or trauma as age and gradual degeneration are frequently the issue. Fortunately, you can prevent a loss of motion in the spine and decrease your chance of injury by performing a few basic stretches.

The lower lumbar rotation stretch is performed while lying on your back with both knees bent and the bottoms of your feet flat on the floor. Roll your knees to one side while keeping both shoulders flat (picture 1). Rotate until you feel a gentle stretch in the lower back region and hold for 30 seconds. Perform three repetitions of the exercise to each side twice a day.

The prayer stretch gets its name because of the position in which it is performed. Feel free to try it before any four-foot putt to save par, but it is probably more effective as a stretch. Sit back on your heels while you are face down and reach forward with your arms (picture 2). You will feel a stretch in the lower back all the way up to the shoulders, depending on which areas are tightest. After reaching forward, try reaching to the right side with both arms and then to the left (picture 3). Hold each position for 30 seconds and three repetitions.

The final exercise (not shown) is in standing and addresses back extension or a backward bend. Stand tall with hands on hips. Lean backwards arching your lower back within a comfortable range. Hold the position one or two seconds for five repetitions. This is an exercise that can be performed frequently throughout the day. It is especially effective if your work or daily activities require prolonged sitting or lifting.

For most people these exercises are appropriate twice a day. But if you have pain in the lower extremities or back you should contact your doctor before attempting. Another reason to consult your doctor about the exercise is if you have had back, hip or knee surgery as they may not be appropriate for you.

The beauty of these exercises is you can have them done before you get to the bathroom to start the morning routine, or while watching your favorite show at night. Add a few simple stretches to your day and prepare yourself for next golf season. I hope that these exercises will prevent injury on the course, and as we deal with the snow-shoveling season.



Accordingly, Cheryl earned a Registered Nursing degree in 1985 and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business in 1989. However, the family wine-making enterprise kept its hold on her, and she returned to the fold in 1990, working in various facets of the business.

All the while, she dreamed of creating her own wine brand. "I have always wanted to create my own wine with a style and flavor profile that appealed directly to women," says Cheryl.

Cheryl began the project, called HandCraft Artisan Collection, in early 2010 when she teamed up with veteran winemaker Alicia Ysaia to develop a wine that would be fruit-forward, distinct and easy to enjoy—similar to the field wine blends that Cheryl recalled from her family's dinner table. The line includes Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Petite Syrah, as well as the more rarely seen (for California) Pinot Grigio and Malbec, featured below.

As part of her passion to make a positive difference in people's lives, Cheryl created "HandCraft Cares" to support important causes with financial and in-kind donations. She is involved in a number of initiatives at the community level to increase awareness and early detection of breast cancer. Since 2012, HandCraft has contributed \$220,000 to support breast cancer research, prevention, and awareness.

2014 HandCraft Pinot Grigio \$12 This pinot grigio underwent a cold-temperature fermentation and was aged entirely in stainless steel, for those of you put off by any oak. It is nearly colorless in the glass. But, no worries. The nose offers aromas of peaches and tropical fruit, with a floral background.

In the mouth, the wine is medium bodied, with flavors of melon and key lime. It offers a nicely balanced, crisp acidity, and the finish is relatively short.

Enjoy this easy-going wine with Swordfish with Tarraogn Beurre Blanc, Tomatoes, and Black Olives, Chicken Marsala Burgers, or Crab with Bok Choy and Egg Stir Fry. 2013 HandCraft Malbec \$12 Deep purple in the glass, this Malbec delivers aromas of plums and blackberries on the nose. The ripe plum continues as you begin to taste, complemented by a hint of dusty cocoa. The wine has a medium body and a medium finish, accompanied by a fair amount of tannins, but nothing excessive. A good value at this price.

This wine would go nicely with Guinness Pub Burgers, Oaxacan Black Mole with Braised Chicken, or Slathered Mesquite-Smoked Ribs.

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A Case of Mistaken Hosel Hockey

They're merciless. They are golf's unspoken disgraces. They seize your throat like Cujo and choke out your soul. They call into question your golf swing. Your sanity. Your humanity. They induce panic like black ice on a highway, like locking eyes with the weird cousin in public, like a toilet-paperless Porta-John.

Think running out of gas in strange, scary city. A dead furnace at 2:00 am on a Sunday in February. Malfunctioning sedatives before a colonoscopy.

But they're not just panic, they're confused panic, like someone strangling you from behind, in the dark, while they ask you an impossible Trivial Pursuit question.

They're not like a slump in baseball or basketball because those don't sneak up on you. The Shanks attack you like a figment of Robert Allenby's imagination outside a Honolulu strip club. And they arrive at the worst times, like when you're hosting your father-in-law and his buddies at your home club.

I'm one over through two, lining up my second shot on a long par 4. I had settled into a rhythm with Bill and his buddies. We're even for the moment—not that I'm counting. Luckily, we get along and we share a fondness for his daughter and for golf. I tell myself he's better because he's retired and plays more, but in truth he's just better. That stings. A little background on Bill: 1) I can't tell you what he did for a living. 2) When suitors came to the house when my wife was in high school, he would position himself prominently at the kitchen table, cleaning his gun. Think De Niro in *Meet the Parents* meets De Niro in *Goodfellas*. Just a little more intimidating.

I finish my pre-shot routine, begin my remarkably mediocre backswing—later Bill likened it to that of Jim Furyk (my least favorite tour player)—with my 4 iron, start down, release, and ... there goes a flaming squirrel headed on a line toward the wrong hole.

And so begins the most befuddling, horrifying six holes of my life.

Anyone who's suffered the shanks knows their paradoxical nature: on the one hand, you know they can't possibly last; on the other hand, you know they're not called "the shank." The plurality of the affliction makes it that much more sinister. Those unspeakable putting woes are not called "the yip." If so, Ian Baker-Finch might be on the course instead of welling up in the booth every time an Aussie drains a three footer.

Back to my round with Bill. To compound the crisis, he tries to help, "Relax, Rory. You're trying too hard because my friends are here." To which I politely respond, "No offense Bill,

but I don't give a (bleep) about your friends." Now consider in what context speaking to your father-in-law like this would be acceptable. Had I taken that tone anywhere but on the golf course in the midst of a tussle with the shanks, I'd be limbless at the bottom of the Chicago River.

Truth is, I'm not nervous—at least I don't feel nervous. And yet his "help" actually pisses me off even more. Here I am, a 36-year-old man being spoken to like a three-year-old trying to catch a Nerf football. It's beyond embarrassing. It's emasculating.

For the first time ever, I'm relishing longer holes because that means I can hit a shank-immune club. Alas, I stripe a driver, then a hybrid on #6, walk confidently to the green, putt out, then half-strut to the #7 tee with cautious optimism.

#7 calls for a 5-iron—when you're fighting the shanks, just the word "iron" causes dread. As I stand over the ball, I'm reminded of my high school Humanities teacher, who taught us that organized religion arose to answer three simple questions: Where did we come from? Why are we here? Where are we going? After scuttling a scalded dog 30 yards off line, through the pine trees, and onto the fifth tee, I was asking the same three questions about the shanks. I'm not one to argue about religion, but I can say, definitively—thanks to the shanks—that there is a hell.

People often describe golf as "humbling." I'll spot you a few more letters: at its worst, golf is humiliating. There is nowhere to hide, no clock to save you, no teammate to pass the ball to, no injury to feign, no coach to ask for a breather. A shooting slump in basketball means you might be missing the hoop by a few centimeters; in golf—while in truth the difference is even smaller—what's visible is a miss that is not only off line, but potentially dangerous. Baseball is different because the odds are you won't hit the ball. Three out of ten is actually pretty good.

What's most amazing about that day is not that I managed to break 90, but that upon closer examination, I only shanked the ball four times. Four times? Really? It felt like 50. It felt infinite. But like other forms of abuse, we learn to repress the shanks; in fact I've already forgotten. To even speak those words, the shanks, is sacrilege to most golfers. I expect Bill to remind me though. Unless I can't hear him from the bottom of the Chicago River.
